Greenville Health Authority Board of Trustees award \$100,000 in grants to local nonprofit organizations

GREENVILLE, SC – The Greenville Health Authority Board of Trustees awards Healthy Greenville, Too Grants, totaling \$100,000, to fourteen nonprofit organizations serving the residents of Greenville County.

Greenville Health Authority President, Phillip Liston, said, “We are so excited to see these Healthy Greenville, Too micro grants make an immediate impact in our community. We appreciate the efforts of each of these organizations who directly provide supportive services to the citizens of Greenville County.”

Just-awarded grants benefit a range of projects such as children’s cancer care, foster care services, student and youth activities and services, and mental health services. The following organizations received grants:

Camperdown Academy - *Scholarship endowment project*

Cancer Survivors Park Alliance – *Cancer Survivors Day Program*

Center for Educational Equity – *Youth academic services and fitness opportunities*

Children's Cancer Partners of the Carolinas – *Treatment access and homecare for children*

Fostering Great Ideas - *Life Coach for youth in foster care*

Momentum Bike Clubs - *Creating two all-girls middle school bike clubs*

Multiplying Good - *Students In Action - youth leadership program*

Nicholtown Child and Family Collaborative – *Providing family mental health services*

Prevent Child Abuse Pickens County - *Provide free counseling services to youth of the Salvation Army Boys & Girls Club*

Public Education Partners – *Training educators in Conscious Discipline & classroom management*

Slater Marietta Community Association – *Farmers Market - Connecting farmers and community*

Taylor's Free Medical Clinic - *Increase access to prescription medication services and cost support*

United Ministries – *Increase mental health counseling services*

Urban League of the Upstate - *The McClaren Scholars Program - two-year pilot program for African American high school juniors and seniors*

The Healthy Greenville, Too grant process annually awards up to \$100,000 to qualified, not-for-profit organizations which are not traditional health services delivery organizations, but provide a valuable charitable purpose that improves the well-being of the people of Greenville. All applicants to the process receive three recommendations from members of the Greenville County Legislative Delegation and/or other elected officials serving Greenville County.
